Yes, we still have a community service requirement where students from your graduating classes are required to complete 75 verifiable community service hours. Many have asked yes; these hours or experiences can be completed with outside agencies as there are tons of opportunities throughout the community.


The preference and first line of research, however, should always be to find these experiences and log your hours within a system called MyVoluntier. The MyVoluntier platform is embedded in every student's MyBackpack portal which is in essence a "one-stop shop" for a student's apps and files within their APS account. Below is the screenshot of an example of where you are able to find the MyVoluntier app in your MyBackpack. It's the blue lightbulb icon usually embedded somewhere in the middle of all the apps found in Mybackpack. Here's the website to access your MyBackpack account: **MyBackpack**. You will use your same APS network login credentials to access both your MyBackpack and MyVountier accounts.

And if you ever complete a volunteer experience with any of these events, then you must simply get the person who sponsored or supervised it to write you a letter **on the agency's or organization's official letterhead** that contains the following items bulleted below, and you must submit this letter to your Midtown HS counselor ~

- A description of what community service project you assisted with or completed.
- Your total number of hours
- The date(s) you served or volunteered
- Their full contact information

Attendance/Transportation: We will only have one APS school bus as our form of transportation - subsequently, we are gearing to take only <40 highly motivated, college prep, college bound 12th and 11th graders. Reservations are based on a first-comefirst-serve structure, so once we (the counselors) have received <40 permission forms completed correctly, the trip will be closed. Parents/guardians who seek to take their own children are free to do so, however, supervision will be the sole responsibility of that parent/guardian for their own children. For the students who'll be riding the APS bus, this is a district sponsored event and the periods for which these students miss - which we're estimating periods 2B and 3B, will be appropriately coded upon our arrival back to Midtown. For the students who attend with their parent, the parent is responsible for providing our attendance department with the appropriate documentation.

Preparation: It is strongly recommended for 12th graders to bring a copy of their transcript. How's that done? Please submit your request via your account in Midtown's Parchment platform. When doing so, make certain that you carefully identify your high school start/end years because if you get it wrong, you will sadly be charged every time you use the service. Parchment is a free service for our current students. Once you submit your request, your assigned counselor will upload and electronically send your transcript to whatever destination you've specified in your request. So, in this instance, you should indicate that you're the recipient or destination. Then you'll be able to print your transcript and have it with you at the fair for college admissions reps to review. Make sense? - Year of a 12th level science (any science that you've not had. Midtown offers Oceanography, Forensic Science, Anatomy Physiology, or any AP level of science)
- Semester of American Government Civics
- Year of World History
- Year of US History
- 2 years of the same World Language
- Year of a course in the CTAE or fine arts area
- Year of PE (that year must comprise of a semester of personal fitness and semester of a PE elective such as rec games, lifetime sports, team sports, weight training, yoga, physical conditioning, etc.)
- Semester of general health
- Approximately 4 years of some thematic pathway or electives
- 40+ hours of verifiable community service for the 2024 graduating class. 75 hours for all other graduating classes.

***Special note:** For math, there are some students who began high school with a higher level than Algebra 1, for them they'll simply need to demonstrate that they've completed

Algebra 1 prior to coming to high school. There are some students who began high school with Foundations of Algebra, and for them their math track is as follows \sim

- Foundations of Algebra
- Algebra 1
- Geometry
- Algebra II

Registration for the 2023 fall session with **AVA (Atlanta Virtual Academy)** part-time program will begin today Monday July 24.

For the many students who are interested in taking one and/or possibly even two classes virtually through the AVA platform during this upcoming fall semester in addition to their Midtown HS schedule, then you may want to proceed with this registration process. **Carefully read instructions below**.

Why would or should you take a virtual course through AVA's part-time program?

- Reason #1 You failed a course or courses from the previous semester or previous year, and you did not re-enroll in the course, nor did you enroll in any credit recovery program, and so now you are in need to recover the credit and/or redo the course(s).
 This is called CR or Credit Recovery.
- **Reason #2** You're on-track for graduation and you are simply seeking to get ahead in your credits. You're interested in taking a course or courses that you'd ordinarily take in the next school year. Therefore, when you take a course in this manner it allows you to advance and possibly graduate early. **This is called IC or Initial Credit**.

Once you are on the AVA application/registration website, the first page is general demographic information. Please appropriately complete this portion. Reach out to the counselors if you do not know your network ID or lunch number.

The second page is where you will select your course(s). You may select up to two. However, for students who need or are seeking to take only one course, you'll have to select the same course twice, otherwise the site will not allow you to move forward. The letters A and B are written next to each course. The letter "**A**" represents the course's 1st semester's portion, and "**B**" is the

2nd semester's portion. Then for the **CR** and **IC**, again remember the **CR** is **credit recovery**, while **IC** is **initial credit**.

The website's third page - this is where you must select your assigned counselor. See here for who your counselor is:

- If you are a 10-12th grader with last names A-G, your counselor is Rucker, Katrina and her email is Katrina.rucker@atlanta.k12.ga.us

Once your application has been successfully submitted, it will be reviewed by your counselor, and if approved your counselor will provide you with your course(s) details prior to **Friday August 4**. Please do not email requesting a rush for this information as the approval process takes time as your transcript must be reviewed prior to us enrolling you into any of these virtual courses. Moreover, no student will be granted access to any of these courses prior to **Tuesday August 1**. Please **carefully review** this AVA flyer/postcard pasted immediately below as it details important dates. These dates are hard deadlines and not negotiable. For example, **September 29** is the final day for dropping a course during fall semester, so if you are enrolled in a course on or after **September 29**, then whatever grade you earned will be posted to your transcript.
